




# NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Year B

## Weekend of August 11/12, 2018

*Embracing Villa Maria and  
St Patrick's Fortitude Valley*

The Cathedral was filled to overflowing last Wednesday as we celebrated the Mass for the **Solemnity of St Mary MacKillop**, Australia's first saint but also Patroness of our Archdiocese. Joining the Archbishop were the Sisters of St Joseph, representatives from Brisbane Catholic Education schools and parishioners from around the Archdiocese and beyond. The Mass was a joyous celebration of faith.



At the end of the Mass the Archbishop launched the new **Mary MacKillop Walk** – an informative, interactive booklet that allows you to “pray in the footsteps of Mary”. It is amazing to think that not only did Mary MacKillop live and work in Brisbane, but we are standing on the same ground that Mary walked! In preparation for the launch of the booklet the **Mary MacKillop Windows** at Penola Place were refurbished.

Showing objects and images related to the life of Mary MacKillop and the Sisters of St Joseph, this year the windows explore the devotion to St Joseph and the Sacred Heart as well as Josephite Education. If you have not had the chance, after mass take a few moments and have a look at the windows and view the artefacts and display boards.

It is from the **Mary MacKillop Windows** that the “walk” begins. The booklet invites you to follow the plaques that eventually leads to the chapel. Using historical facts, prayers and reflections, with further information available through QR codes, the booklet is a journey that connects Mary MacKillop with our journey today.

If you are in the city during the week and would like to explore the **Mary MacKillop Walk**, the booklet is available from the **Guides and Welcomers** desk at the entrance to the Cathedral. Enjoy the walk!


# Music at the 10.00am Solemn Mass




### CATHEDRAL CONCERT SERIES
