Dear friends,

After a week of festivities in the Cathedral, the liturgical calendar directs our attention to something more than time and stone. On Trinity Sunday, the liturgy draws us into the heart of the matter and reminds us why we are so keen on building houses or communities. Buildings are not just for shelter and communities are not just for security. We develop structures that bind us because we are made in the image and likeness of God. And God is no self-contained entity. God is one continuous outpouring of love, firstly from the Father to the Son by the bridge of the Spirit that unites them. And not content with looking into the eyes of each other, they pour their love out into Creation itself, so that everything and everyone might know the desire to be joined and united with something beyond ourselves. So that is why we build families, communities, and societies. It is why we explore and are curious. It is why we are creative and sing and play and dream. It is why we lament the tragedies and disasters of this world. It is why we seek justice and the renewal of the human family and the planet itself. God has made us to reach outwards because God's very nature is to reach outwards. That is what the Trinity means. It is not a theological

formula but helps us understand who we are and why we are. The secular calendar also asks us to take a look closer to home. Today is Sorry Day in which we lament, in that great scriptural tradition, the wrongs of the past and seek to understand the ways in which we are beneficiaries of the injustices committed by others. Some one once said to me something along these lines, "I became wealthy because I stayed silent. I saw the culture of corruption but remained on the fringes of it all. I fed my family, and then saw that I could set them up for life. I chose to be carried by the river of false gold. I am rich but still feel so poor". Sorry Day prompts us towards a similar realisation. Our nation cannot be wealthy while its original people are left behind. While this inequity remains, we might consider ourselves comfortable and grateful for our opportunities, but in truth, we all remain "so poor".

Scriptural lamentation is the opposite to silence; it is the sound of tears for all the injustices of life. Sorry Day and Trinity Sunday go hand-in-hand; both are about the pouring out into creation the healing hands of love that bind the wounds of the broken-hearted and make us all one in the image and likeness of God. *Fr. Anthony*






