Dear friends,

Jesus compares the kingdom of God to a mustard seed today. The lessons of the seed is that faith is all about growth, change and becoming more mature in our relationships. And this doesn't happen all of a sudden because a seed doesn't grow into a tree in an instant.

One of the great early teachers of the Church, 4th century St. Cyril of Jerusalem, taught the newlybaptised about growing into faith and to explain this, he also used the image of the seed. Cyril said that for Christians, faith first touches our minds and our imaginations. Faith is like an "eye", he taught, that helps us see and understand our life and our world. This the first step in faith, but Cyril also said that there is a second step. Faith also leads us to action, and this action is not just ours alone, because faith is also action in partnership with God. God adds to what we do in life, so our Christian service produces more than we could ever achieve on our own.

God value-adds to our small, daily acts of Christian living. In the words of Cyril, "For just as a grain of mustard seed is of little bulk but of explosive energy, so too the faith present in a person's soul achieves the greatest things by the smallest of decisions". It is God who provides the explosive energy hidden in the seed of faith.

So, as Jesus and Cyril and teachers countless other throughout the ages have reminded us that growth in faith is the work of a lifetime. And the truth that Jesus teaches us is that even a little faith goes a long way. Even the smallest daily "yes" to God can have, to repeat the words of Cyril, the most explosive possibilities. This is because faith is less about our "yes" to God and more about God's "yes" to us. It is God who plants the seed; it is God who makes it grow; it is God who produces the harvest. Our task is simply to hold our little seed of faith, our quiet "yes" to God, in gentle, patient hope, and allow God's will to unfold. *Fr. Anthony*

All glory to the Father, Son, And to the Holy Spirit be; As from the first it was, is now, And will be for eternity.




