Dear friends,

In a little over two months, the Archdiocese of Brisbane will hold **SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New**. This significant gathering of 150 people from across the Archdiocese will take place at the Holy Spirit Seminary's Xavier Centre on **September 6 and 7 and October 11 and 12**. The **SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New** Opening Mass and Closing Mass will be open to public with more information to be made available in the coming weeks. Listed below are some answers to frequently asked questions:

Q: Who will be attending SYNOD24: I Am Making All Things New?

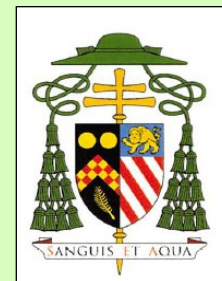
A: This gathering of the faithful will represent the full diversity of our Archdiocese and will include young people, members of multicultural communities, representatives from Archdiocesan agencies and organisations, representatives from social justice organisations and health care, lay representatives from each deanery, religious men and women from a range of orders, clergy representatives and our

vicars and bishops. The synod will be overseen by Archbishop Mark Coleridge with Bishop Tim Norton SVD as Chair. A full list of all those attending will be published in the lead up to the first session in September.

Q: Why did the Archbishop choose "I Am Making All Things New" as the scripture?

A: "I am making all things new" comes from Revelation 21:5 and is a reminder to us all to allow the Holy Spirit to make all things new within us. Synodality is about listening to the voice of the Holy Spirit in the stories, experiences and challenges of all those in our community so we can discern the right path to travel together. It is about listening with open minds, hearts, and ears so that we truly respond to what the bold creativity of the Holy Spirit is asking of us. To truly listen to others then means that we need to let go of our own agendas and even our hurts, so we are made new, walking together in the hope, joy and mission of the Risen Christ.

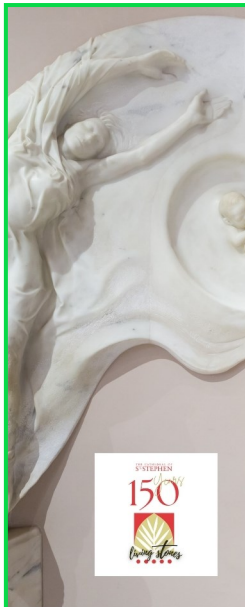

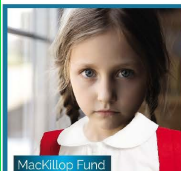

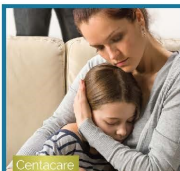

Because of you, six Mary MacKillop Bursary Fund students could graduate Year twelve in 2023.

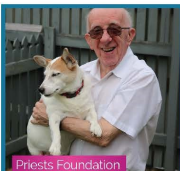

With your gift, you have given women and children fleeing domestic violence a safe space.

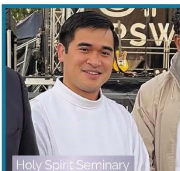

SYNOD24 marks the *Implementation Phase* of the Fifth Plenary Council. Since 2018 our Australian Church has been asking the question: "*What is the Holy Spirit asking of us at*

this time"?. Through listening, dialogue and discernment your voices have been heard and captured through Fifth Plenary Council Decrees. If you wish to read the Decrees and associated documentation, these may be accessed at <https://plenarycouncil.catholic.org.au/>

Now it is time to move our Archdiocese into action.

"How can we be a more co-responsible church on mission?"

On September 6th and 7th and October 11th and 12th of 2024, the Archdiocese of Brisbane will celebrate a Synod to mark the next phase of the Plenary Council journey, the *Implementation Phase*. The Synod24 sessions will be held in the Xavier Centre at Holy Spirit Seminary, Banyo, with the Opening and Closing Masses (which will be open to the public) to be held in the ACU Chapel at Banyo.

Our Archdiocesan Synod will discern the practical and Spirit-led actions that we, as the Archdiocese of Brisbane, need to undertake in the Implementation Phase of the Plenary Council. Bearing in mind that the Decrees have yet to be officially approved by the Apostolic See, these actions will be practical and able to be implemented immediately.
