Dear friends,

Jesus takes the hard work out of getting ready to head off on a trip by instructing us to travel lightly: "take nothing for the journey except a staff - no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses." This is packing made easy.

baggage-limits might Iesus' prompt us to ask: Why is it that we carry so much stuff around with us? Packing a complete wardrobe for our trips away is one thing, but we also carry a lot of unnecessary "emotional baggage" "unresolved trauma" as well; all those subconscious thoughts and seething memories that we carry with us. When we carry around "emotional baggage", we recycle experiences and they contaminate the present. And so in new situations, and among new people, we find ourselves thinking or doing exactly the same things that we promised ourselves we wouldn't do. This is because we have carried too much stuff around with us, in our memories, our hearts, our spirits.

Learning to travel light is good advice. We won't get too far with too much lead in our saddles. Jesus does make one concession for the traveller—Jesus allows to take something to lean on: a "staff". So this leads us to ask a second question: what or who do you lean on through the journey of life?

Hopefully, we all have people around us whom we can lean on when the going is tough, but beyond those people, the staff that might most come in handy is the "staff of faith". This staff becomes very personal because it bears the marks of where we have been, carries the imprint of our hands, is stained by our blood, sweat and tears and shaped by each stage of life's journey. This "staff of faith" is quite remarkable because it becomes stronger the more we use it and the more distance we carry it. It is this personal staff of faith that turns our life journey into a pilgrimage and by this we are gradually freed from the load that we carry. *Fr. Anthony*
