Hello Everyone,

My name is Fr Michael Tran. Following my ordination to the priesthood, I have now been appointed Associate Pastor of Cathedral parish.

It has been over a month since my ordination, and it has been a time of mixed emotions in my life.

In the early days of June, the word I t h e heard most was: congratulations! However, by the end of June, the word I heard in the messages and emails I received was: condolences. My father passed away not long after my ordination. In just 10 days, my family held two big events: the thanksgiving ceremony for my ordination and the funeral ceremony for my father. Both events were attended by many people. They came to share the joy, and they also came to share and sympathize with our family during this difficult time.

Looking back over the past month, I have realized that if life has happy things, then there will also be sad times. In those times, we always need to have relatives and friends by our side.

"Be happy with those who are happy, and weep with those who weep." (Romans 12:15)

My family and I have experienced the different emotions of happiness and sadness. However, there is one thing in common that we clearly experienced: God's love and miraculous providence.

In this weekend's Gospel, St Mark seems to summarize the entire appearance of Jesus in the statement: "When Jesus saw a large crowd, and he took pity on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd." (Mark 6:34)

This is the whole revelation of God's love for humans.

Instead of a God above, the Judge, Jesus revealed to us a God who entered human history; a God born as a baby; a God who also knows what suffering is; a God with a compassionate and forgiving heart; a God who is close to humans, present in every human breath.

Friends, God takes pity on us all, let us enjoy it.
